Throughout her treatment, she continued to exercise and credits cycling with giving her the strength and endurance to survive.

Combining her determination as a cancer survivor and expertise in marketing, she and her husband Dave founded an annual event and national charity, Cycle for Survival, which has raised more than \$5 million for cancer research.
